



Louis Scott Memorial Park



The blue Eagle trail was inspired by the highest rank in Scouting, and the blue in the rank patch. This .72 mi. out and back journey begins just off the Boy Scout Lot and stops at Ridley Creek, and is a great place to sit on the bench and watch as the river slowly flows by.

Out & Back Post Route




The red Life trail was inspired by the red heart found on the rank patch. This .59 mi. loop features each of the ranks for Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts, see if you can find them all along the trail between posts 8 and 3. We invite troops to have their bridging ceremonies at Post 10.

The yellow Star trail was inspired by the yellow star on the rank patch. This .81 mi. out out & back trail winds along Ridley Creek. This is the most adventurous of the routes, as its proximity to the river and marsh can cause some muddy conditions, so "Be Prepared" and bring those boots.
