Fallen Trees and Insurance Coverage (provided by AAA)

If your car is damaged by a fallen tree or limbs, you need to file a claim with your vehicle policy's comprehensive coverage. If your tree falls on your house your homeowners insurance will cover removal of the tree and any repairs due to the damage. If your tree falls on your neighbor's house, your neighbor's homeowners policy would provide insurance coverage. If the neighbor's tree falls on your house you would file a claim with your insurance company. Be aware that if a tree on your property is decayed/weak and you don't do anything about it and it comes down and causes damage you could be held liable.
