January 27, 2026

The Upper Providence Township Council held the regularly scheduled monthly Business meeting on Tuesday, January 27, 2026, at the Upper Providence Township Building. Chairperson Ms. Peterson called the business meeting to order at 7:01 pm and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call

Present: Mr. Akarsoy, Ms. Peterson, Mr. Steinberg and Ms. Scheuerman. Also in attendance was Mr. Luber Township Manager, Mr. Ewald, Solicitor, Police Chief, Ms. McCloskey, Administrative Liaison, A. Murthy, Junior Council.

Public Forum

1. Cynthia Sabatini – UPT resident – Thanked the public works for all the work they put in during the last snow event – they did a wonderful job; interested in learning about the \$600,000 multi-modal grant; Municipal complex agenda items
2. Bob Craft – UPT Resident – lawn equipment proposed ban; he would like a recycling program for lithium batteries (there are 4 HHW collections every year run by the County); he does not like the use of the salt on the roads for the ice and snow; classified wetlands

Awards, Presentations and Announcements

- Vale and Abby from Environmental Commission were present to do a presentation on the 2025 accomplishments and 2026 goals
- The Township has been awarded a \$604,000.00 multi0modul grant for a connecting sidewalk infrastructure from Stevenson's Auto to the new Sunoco, to include filling in gaps, ADA curb cuts, etc.
- Chris McFadden from Media Little League was present to talk about two initiatives this year, which is their 75th year.
 - They are starting a challenger league for players with disabilities
 - They are working toward ADA compliance and are looking for more grants for same. They want to pave the upper parking lot and put walkways between the fields;
 - They have a large list of repairs and updates to complete and need to connect to public sewer
 - Discussions were had about adding Upper Providence to the name of the League

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- Mr. Luber advised that the Road Crew was out for 36 hours during the snowstorm. We had very few complaints. The guys did a great job.

Municipal Boards Commission and Authorities

- Two openings on the Sewer Authority in the 3rd and 4th Districts
- Once opening on the Environmental Commission – this will be filled tonight
- Michael Geise introduced himself as an applicant to the Environmental Commission and provided his background. He spoke about his service project – interest in birds

Mr. Akarsoy made a motion, seconded by Ms. Scheuerman, to appoint Michael Geise from the 1st District to his first full 4-year term on the Environmental Commission with said term ending on December 31, 2029, at which time he will be eligible for a second term if so desired.
