**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING UPPER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT  
TO APPLY FOR THE 2024/25 JAG SINGLE SOLICITATION LOCAL INITIATIVES GRANT  
OFFERED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA COMMISSION ON CRIME & DELINQUENCY (PCCD)**

**WHEREAS**, License Plate Recognition (LPR) pole cameras were purchased by the township using funds from the BusPatrol program that began in October 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, the existing cameras have been a very successful tool in enhancing investigations within our township, identifying and comparing plates against those of cars driven by people suspected of being involved in illegal activities, sharing information and data to advanced local and mutual aid investigations, and identify minor vehicle infractions, like expired registrations, suspended registrations and even stolen vehicles; and

**WHEREAS**, Upper Providence Township of Delaware County Police Department needs additional 6 License Plate Recognition (LPR) cameras that would consist of four pole cameras at the 4-way intersection of N. Providence Rd & Bishop Hollow Rd and 2 pole cameras on State Rd at Crum Creek Rd; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime & Delinquency (PCCD) provides funding for the purchase of License Plate Recognition (LPR) cameras through 2024/25 JAG Single Solicitation Local Initiatives projects.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that we, the Officials of Upper Providence Township, Delaware County, Pennsylvania, in regular session on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of March 2024, hereby made a decision for a JAG grant application in the amount of \$26,000 of the Pennsylvania Commission of Crime & Delinquency for the purchase of six (6) License Plate Recognition (LPR) cameras.
